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FAQ - PARCEL SPLIT PROCESS

If you have made the decision to divide (aka split) your parcel, the following steps will assist in making the process move forward:

1. Decide how the parcel is to be reconfigured and have legal descriptions prepared. You may want to contact a licensed Florida surveyor for assistance in crafting the legal descriptions and/or acquiring a property survey.
2. Contact the jurisdiction's (municipal or unincorporated) zoning/redevelopment department in which the parcel is located for written approval to split.
 - a. To determine your jurisdiction, go to www.pcpao.gov and search for, then click on, your property. If the resulting parcel summary displays "Unincorporated" you will contact the [Pinellas County Planning and Zoning](#) department. Otherwise, the [Municipality](#) to contact is listed under Current Tax District.

3. As per [Section 197.192, Florida Statutes](#), "Land shall not be divided until all taxes have been paid." Verify property taxes are paid in full with the Pinellas County Tax Collector's Office at <https://pinellastaxcollector.gov/property-tax/>
4. Once the above is done, complete and submit [Parcel Split Request](#) application.
 - a. Include the legal descriptions for the existing and new parcel(s), including any property boundary surveys.
 - b. Include a copy of the jurisdiction's approval to split.
 - c. If the parcel owner is not signing the application, written authorization from the owner must be included.
 - d. If the owner is an artificial entity (e.g., LLC, corporation, LLP, etc.) you must include the title or position of the person signing the form (e.g., Manager, Member, President, Partner, etc.).
 - e. **It is important to please include an email address and daytime phone number** so we may contact you (if needed) and copy you on correspondence.
5. Submit the completed application and supporting documents via email (preferred) to pcpamapping@pcpao.gov or via USPS mail to:
